Vulnerable residents



Government Advice

As we pass three weeks since the government advised everyone to stay at home it's important to be clear on what this is.

Stay at home

- Only go outside for food, health reasons or work (but only if you cannot work from home)
- If you go out, stay 2 metres (6ft) away from other people at all times
- Wash your hands as soon as you get home

Do not meet others, even friends or family. You can spread the virus even if you don't have symptoms.

Keep Your Distance!

You will have ntoiced that all of the play areas on the estate have been locked in line with government instructions about the need for people to keep their distance from each other at this time.

Unfortunately, we are receiving reports that some residents are ignoring this and are either meeting up with friends, exercising in groups or playing. Please don't do this!

If we are to keep all of our friends and neigbours safe everyone must stay in side as much as possible and, when you do go out, you must keep away from anyone not in your household

Concerns about paying your bills

The Council has confirmed it will be relaxing its normal rules on rent arrears and non-payment of council tax. Allowances will also be made for leaseholders who are struggling to pay their service charge bills. However, people are strongly encouraged to continue paying these bills if they are able to.
